Walt Barber, who also co-leads the project, described the ultimate vision, "We are hopeful that after we prepare a compellingly written and illustrated report, we will be able to attract support for a series of YouTube videos or a televised documentary that can reach young people and give them an appreciation of what EPA has achieved."

Stan Meiburg Tapped for Acting Deputy Administrator



Here is the text of Administrator Gina McCarthy's announcement of Stan's return to EPA:

Each and every day, the dedicated public servants of EPA work hard to protect public health and the environment. To help me lead our efforts, I'm thrilled to announce Stan Meiburg as our new Acting Deputy Administrator.

Stan has had a long and distinguished career as Deputy Regional Administrator in Region 4. Just a few months after he thought he retired, I asked Stan to come to Washington to help me deliver on the President's agenda and EPA's mission. That includes fighting climate change,

protecting our water, continuing cleanup work, taking on toxics and chemical safety, and so much more.

Stan has a genuine understanding of EPA's people, its culture, and its mission. He's only the second person in agency history to serve as Deputy RA in two regions-serving in Region 6 prior to Region 4.

Stan's EPA career began in 1977 in Washington, DC as a program analyst. He went on to serve in Research Triangle Park and in Dallas before heading to Atlanta. He holds a BA from Wake Forest University and MA and PhD degrees in political science from The Johns Hopkins University.

His experience spans the agency, having worked closely on air, enforcement, toxics, operations and countless other EPA issues. He's literally done it all, and I know he'll be a great addition to the team.


